COHORT 5 CLP CAMP

The camp proved to be an exciting and deeply insightful experience for the fellows, This year’s camp was held at the Central University Campus in Miotso. Members of faculty for each curriculum block were present to teach and challenge fellows. Besides the learning sessions there was a trip day. There were three main stops on this day namely, the **Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum**, the **House of Parliament** and the **Legon Center for International Affairs and Diplomacy (LECIAD)**. At parliament, the fellows had an interactive session with Hon. Sam Nartey George (Member of Parliament for the Ningo-Prampram constituency.) The session gave fellows the opportunity to understand the need for Christians to actively govern with their faith as a guide. 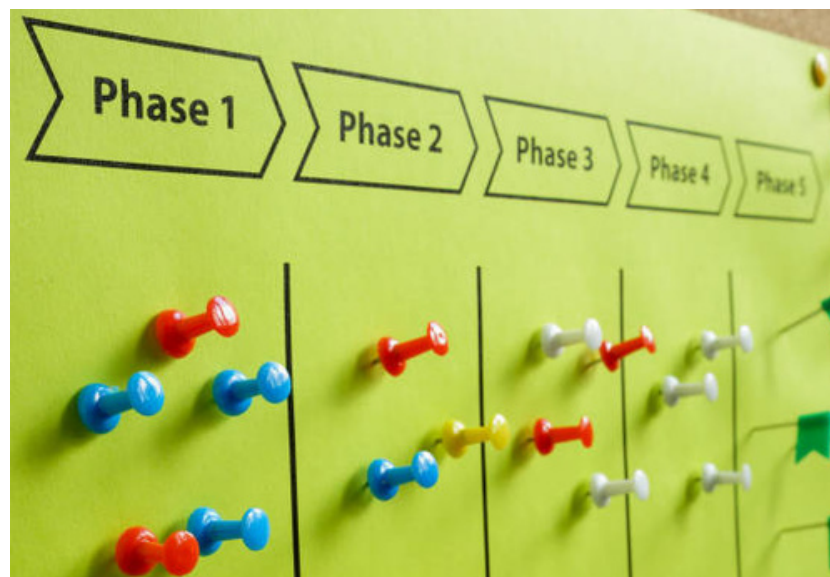

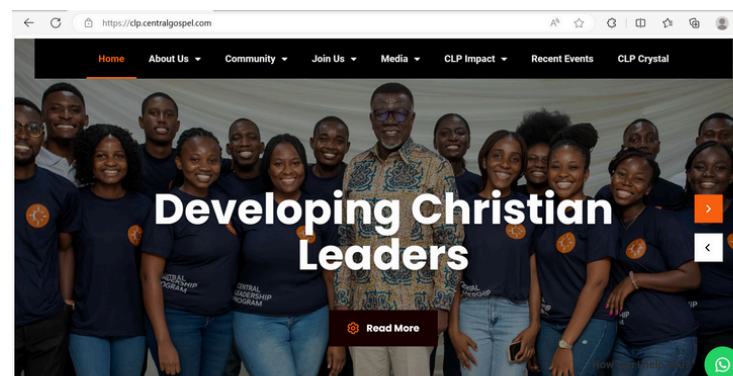

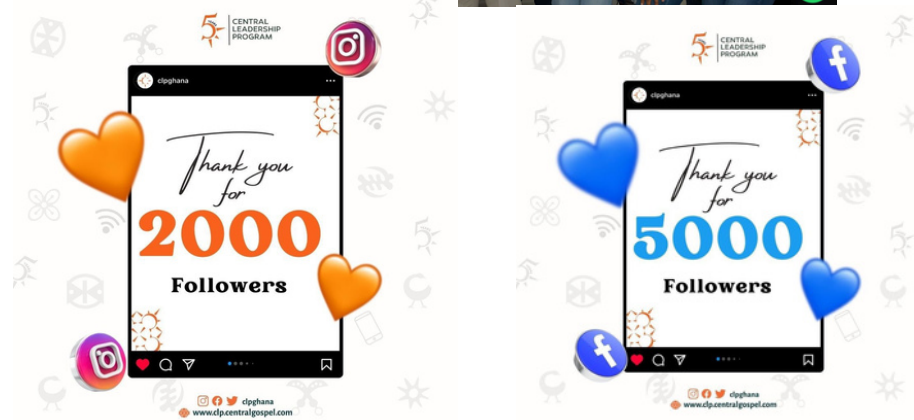
