## CLP Gold

Our flagship program, CLP Gold, is a one-year fellowship aimed at tertiary students and recent graduates aged 18 to 24. This program has been successfully running for the past eight years, and to date, over 120 fellows have participated.

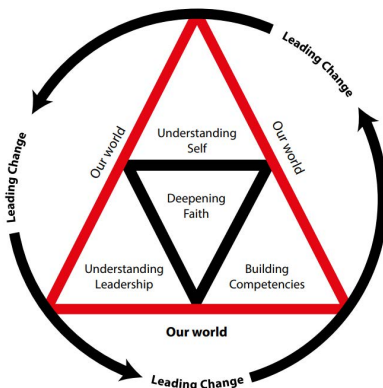
## CLP Crystal

## CLP Platinum

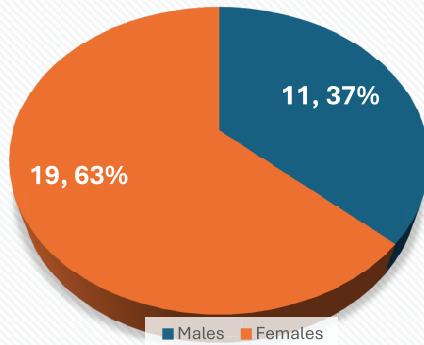

The Central Leadership Program continues to evolve, aiming to shape the leaders of tomorrow through structured, impactful, and relevant learning experiences.

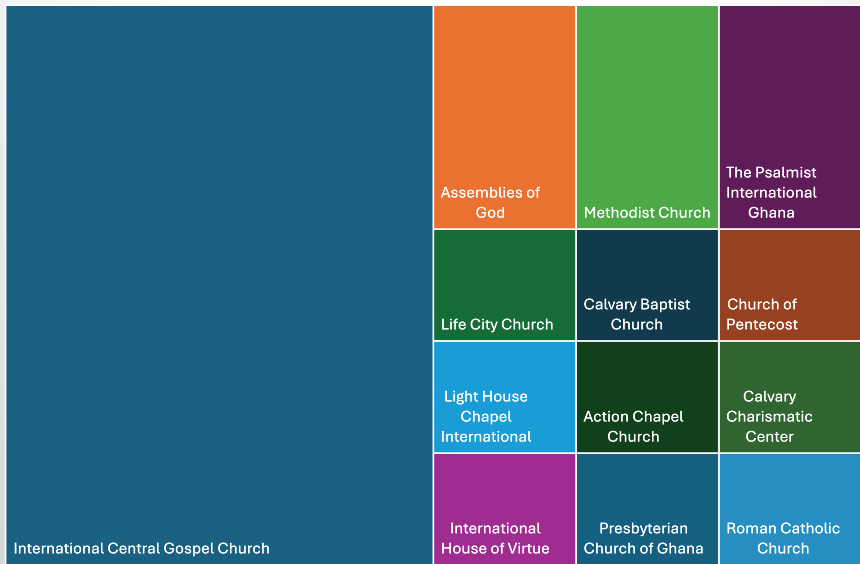


# Demographics of Cohort 8 Fellows

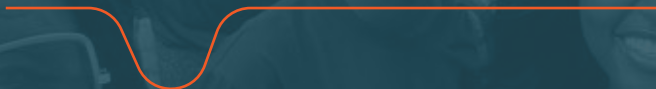

# CABOT-S

CABOT-S is a prevention-focused public health initiative promoting Sickle Cell awareness and early genotype knowledge among young people. The team comprises Bright Sackey, Yaw Owusu-Broni, Yaa Afriyie Amankwah, Crispin Ansu, Virtue Biaku, and Twerenyame Acquaah. Through direct engagements on KNUST campus, about 10,000 people were reached in person, with over 17,000 reached online. Partners included KNUST DoSA, UHS, KATH Blood Bank, and CLP, with guidance from SIP mentor Mr. Agbemashior.



# Team Anidado

## The Bridge Project by Team Anidado

The team (Beryl, Bright, Josephine, Naa Oboshie, Philippa, Sandrine, Ransford), mentored by Sylvia Sinkari, embarked on a four-month youth empowerment initiative at Motherly Love Orphanage, Kwabenya, addressing gaps in preparedness for independent living among orphaned youth.

Aligned with Agenda 2063 Goals 2 and 18, 29 participants were trained weekly in digital, financial, vocational and life skills, improving their confidence, self-awareness and self-reliance.

The team seeks to establish a mentorship network for beneficiaries to ensure sustained impact. Special appreciation goes to ICGC Holy Ghost Temple, all donors and the orphanage management for their support.



# ChangeSmiths

Crafted Futures, led by The ChangeSmiths (Nissi Adu Essel Abaisoo, Kweku Ofori Appiah, Serena Rose Newton, Theophilus Bortelabi Borketey-La, Deborah Jessica Oppong, and Olivetta Dela Alomenu), was implemented in Kokofu, Bekwai Municipality, Ashanti Region. Addressing youth unemployment, we trained 30 participants in four income-generating skills and financial literacy. In partnership with The Church of Pentecost (Kokofu Central) and under the guidance of our SIP mentor, Madam Judith Kabukie Ocansey, we provided startup kits to three beneficiaries, empowering sustainable livelihoods.



# Team Elite

The LIT Project(Lead in Tech), led by a team of seven (Richard Kobby Gavor, Juanita Abrahams-Appiah, Sally Ampem, Sarah Yarborley Abbey, Rhema Naa-Shormeh Noye, Nikon Senyo Agbenohevi and Nana Kwabena Opoku Owusu), was piloted in a public school in Nungua. It addresses limited digital access among JHS students through hands-on digital training, improving digital literacy, confidence, and innovation under the guidance of our SIP mentor (Mr Kweku Larthey).



# TEAM ELEV8

Spring Up by Team Elev8 (Chara-Joy Appiah, Abigail Asiedu-Appiah, Patience Dogbe, Phoebe France, Jeremiah Amlanu, William Quarshie) was at the Senior Correctional Centre, Accra. The project addressed the digital divide by providing essential tech skills to reduce recidivism and support reintegration. Key outcomes included enhanced IT skills among prison officers and strengthened institutional capacity. Supported by SIP Mentor Mr. Akoto John, the project partnered with Woezor TV.

"Africa is in a Season of Reformation. There is a wind of Change, the type that restructures economies and changes social dynamics.
